You should have recently received a message from Executive Director Lisa Carter on an upcoming comprehensive funding campaign to support the future of Agassiz Village.

Our goal in the coming years is to welcome even more campers during summer sessions and to create a sustainable business model by renting out the camp to various organizations and groups in the off-season.



Therefore, the campaign will place a large focus on the renovation and repair of our cabins and facilities. Many of our buildings have been here since before the camp opened in 1935 and are in desperate need of attention. To ensure Agassiz can continue to safely and effectively host hundreds of campers each year, as well as expand business operations, these repairs are central to our goals.

AGASSIZ VILLAGE 2024 PRIORITIES

We had a fantastic 2023, with 452 children attending our summer sessions. However, we are always looking for ways to improve on our offerings to our families. Looking ahead for the rest of the year, we have prioritized the following enhancements and extended services for this summer and beyond:

- Increase the number of campers by 11% with a goal of serving more than 500 children. To achieve this, we will reconfigure camper cabins and bunks to increase capacity and overall enrollment.
- Continue to enhance and improve Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) and overall mental health of both campers and staff. Since COVID, there has been a distinct shift in the needs of our population. This will be addressed through the introduction of two new positions: a Director of Camper Care and a Director of Staff Care to help us better identify and more closely monitor the well-being of everyone on site.
- **Expand our teen program** so that we are serving exponentially more teen campers and providing them with the tools they need to be successful as they finish high school and move on to secondary education or trade opportunities.
- Grow the number of Maine campers. We will continue our commitment to those communities we have historically served while expanding the outreach of our program for children in need of our services in surrounding underserved communities near Poland, Maine.


2024 IN-KIND DRIVE NOW ON AMAZON

Our goal was to replace 85 bunk beds as well as raise and level four bunk houses. Mission achieved—and more! Our incredible facilities staff—Ryan McAlister, Shep Stults, and Vern Stevenson—have built 74 bunk beds and 57 single beds, and several cabins are in the process of being raised and renovated!
