Agassiz 2024 Highlights

NEW LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

This summer we introduced a new program to help teens prepare for high school, college, and the workforce: the iTHRIVE Leadership Program. Offered during the summer sessions and as a year-round program for our 16- to 17-year-olds, iTHRIVE offers youth development based on core principles:

NEW ACTIVITIES

The 2024 sessions saw the addition of three new activities for campers:

Hiking: New trails were built around camp and the culminating activity for the year was a 3-state hiking trip (Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont).

More Water Opportunities: We now offer a junior lifeguard program, sailing lessons and a water vertebra course from our friends at the Thompson Lake Environmental Association.

Funday Saturday: Free Choice Programs include a variety of activities that are not available during the week, such as woodworking, African dance, photography, and ping pong.

Reviving an Historic 3-State Trip

This past summer, Agassiz Village revived an old tradition from its early days of existence: the 3-state trip.

It began in the Appalachian Mountains of Maine, when a group of 16 Agassiz campers had breakfast in Poland before embarking upon their adventure.

Then it was on to the White Mountains of New Hampshire (visible from the Agassiz campus) and a climb up Mount Agassiz. Yes, there really is a Mount Agassiz. It was named for Louis Agassiz, the father of Alexander, after whom our camp is named.

Finally, it was on to the Green Mountains of Vermont, where the group enjoyed dinner at Tirozzi's Bakery in Saint Johnsbury.

Agassiz Welcomes Back Tim DeGavre

Agassiz Village recently had the honor of welcoming back Tim DeGavre, formerly Tim Thompson, and his lovely wife, Caroline, to camp after 65 years!

Tim was a staff member from 1955–1957, working first in the kitchen and living above the dining hall before becoming a cabin counselor for the next two summers. He reflected on his incredible summers here and attributes most of the success he has enjoyed in life to his time spent at Agassiz.

After his last summer at camp, Tim had a post-graduate assignment as an ensign to a destroyer in the North Atlantic. Soon after, a visit from a liaison officer at the Air Force Academy said he would get him into the space program if he joined. (At that time, John Glenn was just going into orbit.)

Tim thought, why not? He became a Second Lieutenant in the Air Force and headed off to ballistic and guided missile school. Among many of his space-related assignments, he was most fond of working on the planning of the Air Force's support to the Saturn Apollo moon-landing program.

After 21 years, Tim retired as a Colonel and became the Station Manager of the Missile and Satellite Tracking Station on Antigua, a far cry from summers at Agassiz Village.
